
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In Memory of Lynne E. Clements



It was around 2010 when Lynne and I first discussed holding a film festival in Ridgewood. She was a customer of mine at Mango Jam for a number of years. She loved the Sidewalk Sale and, over the years, purchased many of my custom wreaths. She came in one day and told me of the film festival she created in Bergenfield.

"I've always thought Ridgewood would be the perfect town to do a film festival with all the culture in town."

She loved Ridgewood and chose to open her office here. She asked if the Ridgewood Guild would be interested in hosting. This was our inaugural year. We were just getting started. To this day I still remember my response. "I'm a huge film fan, but don't know anything about running a film festival." She enthusiastically said she would guide me, and so she did. Our first festival was planned for the spring of 2011. It was a huge success. To this day, we still accept films from all genres: documentaries, short subjects, foreign films, music videos, and her favorite category... student films. In this, our 13th year, in honor of Lynne, we created the Lynne Clements Memorial Award for the "Most Promising Student

Filmmaker." One talented student will be the recipient of an award. How ironic that this year our Warner Theater closed its doors and Lynne decided to leave us.

But there was much more to Lynne than the Ridgewood Guild. She was a clinical psychologist who held her business, Corporate Family Resources, in Ridgewood for over 25 years. She changed location in town 3 times before relocating to Midland Park. Sadly, soon after I helped her set up shop, she became ill.

Lynne was born and raised in Bergenfield and lived there until her passing. She leaves behind her beloved husband Lou, who was also a film festival committee member and Ridgewood Guild volunteer. Her elder son Ryan followed in his mother's footsteps in the therapeutic field and resides on Long Island. Her younger son Glenn resides in L.A. and is a successful screen writer. Most recently, Glenn wrote for James Cordon's Carpool Karaoke. She adored her three grandchildren and proudly showed off their pictures whenever the opportunity rose. In addition, she spoke fondly of her cousins in Australia, oftentimes telling us stories about one cousin who was in the acting profession.

Lynne held several degrees including one from Harvard. She proudly sat on the Board of the Gifted Child and was adored by her clients, family, and friends.

To me personally, Lynne was the most kind, nurturing person I ever met. She would lend her trained ear to anyone who needed some helpful advice. She was there for many of us who were in need.

Lynne, you will be greatly missed by your Ridgewood Guild colleagues and all who have had the pleasure to have known you.

In 1973, seven-year-old Joan D'Alessandro asked her mother Rosemarie if she could deliver a box of Girls Scout cookies to the neighbor and that was the last time Rosemarie saw Joan alive. Twenty years later, under the threat of the murderer's impending release, with the help of her community, Rosemarie fought to keep him in prison.

In her fight, Rosemarie D'Alessandro began a movement, bringing awareness to the impact parole hearings had on the well-being of families that have lost children to violent crime. As she fought for other families, her's began to break apart. Rosemarie became a symbol of hope for her community and a rallying point for victims' parents nationwide. She found strength in her memories of Joan and the belief that something good should come from what happened to her.

When I started to make this film, it was a portrait of a local hero; a mother who dedicated her entire life to her daughter's legacy. Throughout the process, it evolved into an exploration of Rosemarie's journey with grief. I wanted to examine grief as this universal human experience through the lens of the D'Alessandro family. What I did not expect was how I would evolve during the making of this film. Rosemarie introduced me to the incredible community she created for her and her sons and they welcomed me without pretense. Joan's Joy, the organization founded by Rosemarie, is a diverse open-hearted community dedicated to child safety but they are more than an advocacy group; they are a family.

Daughter of Mine is a portrait of a mother's love and loss. It is about the violent rupture of a family.



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


